WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

2008 may be remembered as the year of change. The possibilities are many, including the possibility that we may elect the first woman president or the first black president. But this year may also be remembered as the year when the status quo won; the year when the resistance to change was overpowering. The election of 2008 will test America's sense of justice.

As challenging as this new year is for the nation, it is even more so for us believers. Will we seek to preserve the status quo or will we be agents of change? The writer of the Hebrews challenges us to: "...let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith..." 
